



Washington Post covers Benton Harbor development controversy

The Washington Post's Kari Lydersen reports on the growing controversy over the proposed privatization of Benton Harbor's lakefront park in "[Depressed City Divided over Golf Proposal](#)."

"Can three waterfront golf holes in a 'Jack Nicklaus Signature' course save Benton Harbor, a tumbledown town marked by factory closures, high unemployment, and years of simmering racial frustration and suspicion?" writes Lydersen.

She quotes former Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund board member Lana Pollack: "This is a very poor and desperate community, and it's a company town. ... [Developers] say they are teaching kids to read. But a community shouldn't have to make a choice between whether their kids have after-school tutoring or a public park."
